#### Pastor's Report

Dear Friends in Christ,

Well, 2016 has come to an end and I am so thankful to God for the good work that has been done in and through you, in our congregation and in the world.

You may remember that Bob Atten told us there are still some 2,000 spoken languages that have yet to receive the Word of God in their heart language. Martin Luther would be thrilled to know how far Bible translation has come!

After some hard work by the Session and all of you, Labors of Love has gotten off the ground. A pamphlet to "advertise" this ministry is in the works and through this ministry we can reach out to seniors and veterans in our community. A similar mission project in the towns near Ithaca has been going strong for 10+ years and has expanded to become its own Not-For-Profit corporation. The Covenant will continue to split the cost of my benefits for as long as I am there.

Another challenge was trying to find insurance that would cover all the ministries we may wish to do, including any new uses we may discern for our kitchen, and any ministries that other groups such as Youth for Christ, may want in the future. I am excited to see where God is calling us as we move into 2017.

I encourage everyone to consider prayerfully what ministries each of us are called to. No one can do it all and no one is supposed to. Each of us must consider what special gifts we possess that God will call us to use, keeping in mind that sometimes, that means we sit back and cheer for the others running the race. For this and for all the joy you bring.....To God alone be the glory!

### **Building and Grounds Report**

- The steps were repaired at the entrance to the fellowship hall.
- New composite decking was installed on the front deck and steps.
- Again this past summer we saved money on lawn care, Marie and I volunteered to do the lawn care.
- We had a leak in the boiler system plumbing and it was repaired by Jim Karl and me. Jim donated his professional services and only charged for the parts.
- The dehumidifier in the basement quit working and a new dehumidifier was purchased and installed. The walls in the basement were washed from ceiling to floor with borax and detergent.
- A new time delay light switch was installed in the fellowship hall to allow people to get to their cars before the light goes out.
- New air filters were purchased and installed in the sanctuary air heating system.
- David Schmidt, an engineer, looked at the floor structure under the kitchen and determined it
  was sound but sagging in some spots. I jacked up the beams in several spots and installed new
  supports.
- The snow blower was repaired and filled with fresh gas and is ready to go for the winter.
- The steam table was removed from the kitchen and the gas line was disconnected outside at the propane tank.

## **Personnel Committee Report**

The church personnel are Pastor Patricia Wolff, Organist Judy Ives, Sexton Anna Egli and Secretary Sharon Havens. Pastor Patty is half time at our church and half time at The Covenant in Delhi. The organist receives \$100 per week for inside services and \$75 per week when the services are outside with no choir practice. The secretary is compensated at \$160 per month. The sexton is paid \$25 per week.

#### **Pastor's Terms of Call**

The session proposes the compensation for Pastor Patty at a half time position with 14 days including 2 Sundays study leave, and 28 days with Sundays for vacation include a raise of \$50 per month to \$26,610 for the year. She will be taking 2 days off per week and working 20 hours per work as our pastor.

### **Nominating Committee Report**

The nominating committee consisted of Sharon Havens, chairman, ruling elder April Geiger, and Becky Holley and Sandy DuMond from the congregation. Elder Kathy Schmidt is leaving session after serving 6 years with thanks. There remained a vacancy of one ruling elder for the class of 2016. The nominating committee presents Jan Lafayette and Judy Ives for nomination as ruling elders, class of 2019, for a term of 3 years.

#### **2017 Nominating Committee Election**

From the Bylaws: Two ruling elders shall be designated by and from the session, one of whom shall be chairman, and at least two members who are not session members shall be elected by the congregation at its annual meeting.

Nominations for 2 members from the congregation will be accepted from the floor.
